She holds a degree in Law from the University of Malaga and a PhD in Criminal Law and Criminology from the same university. She has been a lecturer at the Faculty of Law of the University of Malaga since 1993. She is currently Professor of Criminal Law and Director of the Andalusian Interuniversity Institute of Criminology (IAIC). She was a Fulbright Scholar at the School of Criminal Justice at Rutgers University (New Jersey, USA) in 2001. She has been a visiting researcher at the Institute of Criminology in Cambridge (UK), at the Faculty of Law at Queensland University in Brisbane (Australia), at the Institute of Information Sciences at the University of Tsukuba (Japan), at the Institute of Criminology at the Catholic University of Louvain (Belgium) and at the Institute of Criminology (LINC) at the Catholic University of Louvain (Belgium). She is currently part of the research team led by Professor Díez Ripollés and participates in various research projects on criminal policy.

From 2005 to 2007 she was President of the Spanish Society of Criminological Research (SEIC). She has been a member of the scientific committee of the International Society of Criminology (ISC) and a member of the Board of Directors of the European Society of Criminology (ESC).
