He is a visiting professor at the Diego Portales University (Santiago de Chile), the Central American University (Managua, Nicaragua), the Universidad Mayor de San Simón (Bolivia), the London School of Economics (London, United Kingdom), the José Simón Cañas University (San Salvador, El Salvador) and the University of Palermo (Buenos Aires, Argentina). He is currently developing various studies on social problems related to urban security, being co-author in this field of the manual "Environmental Criminology: Ecology of Crime and Security". He is currently the principal investigator of the Consolidated Group of the University System of the Basque Government Applied Criminology (CRIM-AP), classified as category "A".
