She has participated in more than 25 research projects and contracts, many of them as principal investigator. She collaborates in international research networks and groups. Since the beginning of her academic career, she has participated in multiple scientific congresses, seminars and conferences, both national and international. Her research stays abroad include predoctoral (Max Planck Institute in Freiburg, Germany) and postdoctoral (Cardiff University in Wales, United Kingdom), as well as visiting professor at the John Jay College of Criminal Justice in New York (USA) in 2009-2010, and at the University of Coimbra (Portugal) in 2017. She is currently a member of the Board of Directors of the Spanish Society of Criminological Research (SEIC) and Editor-in-Chief of the Spanish Journal of Criminological Research (REIC), in addition to belonging to the evaluation committee of multiple national and international journals of recognized prestige, as well as the National Research Foundation (NFR) of South Africa.
