He is currently Dean of the Faculty of Social and Legal Sciences at the Miguel Hernández University of Elche, director of the Criminal Research Centre for the study and prevention of crime and Professor of Criminal Law. He has more than 80 publications, of which almost a dozen have been published in non-national publishers and magazines. He has participated as a speaker at the European Society of Criminology congress in Prague, at the Australian and New Zealand Society of Criminology congress, at the congress organised by the Council of Europe "Octopus Conference Cooperation against Cybercrime" where he gave a presentation representing COMJIB, at the American Society of Criminology congress in 2013 in Atlanta, as well as at the international congress Rethinking Cybercrime in English which took place in Elche in 2013. He has participated in more than 20 research projects and contracts, being principal investigator in 10 of them, among which are various projects of the national R&D plan together with several different universities. In addition, he has participated in multiple projects of the Generalitat Valenciana R&D plan, as well as in several research contracts funded by the Alicante Provincial Council and the Ombudsman.
