He holds a degree and a PhD in Psychology from the University of the Basque Country and a degree in Criminology from the University of Barcelona. He has trained in forensic psychology at the Forensic Psychology Unit of the University of Santiago de Compostela and the Forensic Psychology Lab of the University of British Columbia in Vancouver (Canada). He is currently a Researcher/Professor at the University of Barcelona developing the requalification program in the Applied Criminology group, Basque Institute of Criminology and Master's Degree in Criminological and Victimological Intervention (Miguel Hernández University). He received 2nd runner-up prize in the Victoria Kent National Award in 2008 (Ministry of the Interior) and the Mariano Yela Award 2014, from the Spanish Society of Legal and Forensic Psychology, in recognition of the young researcher with excellence in research and knowledge transfer. He has participated in the revision of the scale for the assessment of the risk of domestic violence in use by the Ertzaintza and in 2014 and 2015 he participated as an expert in the creation of the Catalan Observatory of Justice in Gender-Based Violence. He has published numerous articles in high-impact journals, as well as chapters and manuals, and in 2017 he published the first manual in Spanish on the assessment of the risk of violence with the publishing house Pirámide.
