Professor of Criminal Law at the Faculty of Law of the Autonomous University of Barcelona (UAB). He holds a PhD in Law and has been the coordinator of the Degree in Criminology at the UAB since 2004. He has been the coordinator of the interuniversity research group "Criminology applied to penology" since 2009, recognised as a consolidated research group by the AGAUR, and which since 2014 has been transformed into an emerging research group made up of researchers from the Autonomous University of Barcelona under the name "Desistance from crime and reintegration policies". He received the award for research excellence in 2008 granted by the UAB for his work: *Is prison criminogenic?: a comparative analysis of recidivism between prison sentences and suspended sentences*. He was the coordinator of the Master's in Criminology and Penal Enforcement between 1989 and 2004, which has 25 editions. He is currently the coordinator of the Criminology Degree at the Faculty of Law of the UAB since 2011, having participated in its development and creation. He has collaborated with the Cambridge Institute of Criminology, the London School of Economics and Political Science and the Università degli Studi di Bologna. He is currently the coordinator of said research group. He has been the editor of the *Revista Española de Investigación en Criminología (REIC)* and a reviewer for multiple national and international scientific journals. He has also been a project evaluator for the National Agency for Evaluation and Prospective (ANEP), Research Foundation Flanders and the National Fund for Scientific and Technological Development (FONDECYT) of Chile.
