She is currently a Professor of Criminal Law at the Autonomous University of Madrid. She holds a degree in Law and a PhD in Law in 2000. She was a FPI fellow of the Ministry of Education (1994-1997). She has completed predoctoral research stays at various German universities (Albert-Ludwigs-Universität-Freiburg, Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität-München, Rheinischen Friedrich Wilhelms - Universität Bonn). She has also completed postdoctoral research stays at the Institute of Criminology, University of Cambridge, and the Columbia Center for Contemporary Critical Thought, Columbia University, New York. She was a member of the Faculty of Law's Permanence Committee from 2000 to 2003 and Vice-Dean of Academic Planning at the same faculty from 2006 to 2008. She was also the Dean's Delegate for coordination of the Master's Degree in Access to the Legal Profession at the UAM in the 2013-2014 academic year. She has participated in 12 research projects, one of them as principal investigator.
